#### **About CONNECT**

The CONNECT School ↔ Community Microgrant Program is an opportunity for Saskatchewan teachers to **facilitate meaningful connections for students in the local community**. A collaboration of passion2action Youth Empowerment and the Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation, this program aims to encourage renewed community engagement in schools, offer leadership development opportunities for students, and encourage active citizenship in and out of the classroom.

The CONNECT program involves four components:



#### Microgrants

Successful applicants from throughout Saskatchewan will be awarded a microgrant of <u>up to \$500</u> to help finance their proposed project. Funds are intended to reduce the financial barrier for teachers to facilitate programs and students to participate.



#### Project Support

From the initial project proposal to facilitating the opportunity with students, our team is there to support participating teachers every step of the way and will be in regular contact to check-in on your progress and provide ideas and guidance.



#### **Leadership Development**

As part of the CONNECT program, teachers will have access to a number of leadership development modules for students to learn important skills for the success of the project and for life. *Use of these modules is completely voluntary*.



#### Networking

To inspire and be inspired, the entire CONNECT cohort comes together (virtually) for monthly check-ins throughout the school year to share project updates and connect with other teachers from throughout the province.

## **Program Eligibility**

Applications to be part of the third CONNECT cohort in the 2025-2026 school year are welcomed from **teachers and school staff from any school in Saskatchewan**.

The following types of projects **are not eligible**:

- Projects supported as part of a previous CONNECT cohort
- Poorly defined projects lacking specific community partners
- Projects connected to fundraising initiatives that do not offer direct community engagement opportunities for students
- Regular or recurring school excursions and trips, or out-of-province travel
- Capital expenses or the purchase of equipment for the school

Priority will be given to projects that involve recurring / sustained opportunities for community engagement, as compared to events and "one-off" interactions.

## **Project Themes**

All proposed projects must align with <u>one or more</u> of the following program themes:



Arts and Culture



Citizenship and Activism



Environmentalism



Social and Emotional Wellbeing



Truth and Reconciliation

The selection panel may give preference to projects that integrate multiple program themes.

### **Application Process**

Applications to be part of the third CONNECT cohort in the 2025-2026 school year are **due by Thursday, October 30 @ 11:59 PM**. Late applications may not be considered.

Please email your completed application to <u>connect@passion2action.ca</u>. You can expect to receive an email response from the passion2action Team within 72 hours confirming receipt of your application.

After applications are received, they will be reviewed by a selection panel composed of representatives from both passion2action and the Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation. **All applicants can expect to receive an email by mid-November** with the decision of the panel. Decisions are considered final.

Successful applicants will be onboarded as part of the third CONNECT cohort in late November. All projects must be completed before the end of the 2025-2026 school year, including submission of a mandatory project report.
